**The CPP (Career Planning Program) gives an estimated ACT composite score range based on the Reading and Numerical Skills sections of the test. The CPP score that will be used for evaluation on this criterion will be the score in the middle of the range (i.e., 26 would be the score used for a score range of 24-28 on the CPP). Although this test is no longer administered, scores earned *prior to July 1, 1999* will be considered.

- A current ACT or NLN Pre-Admission RN Exam is strongly recommended.
- The GPA is cumulative. For students who have not earned 12 graded **non-developmental** college hours at a regionally accredited institution, the GPA earned in a non-regionally accredited institution will be considered next. For those applicants who have fewer than 12 graded credit hours of post secondary work, the high school GPA at the time of graduation, or the GED score will be used.
- 5 additional points will be awarded to applicants who have 12 graded **non-developmental** college hours from a regionally accredited college. The former West KY Vocational College became regionally accredited on January 1, 2004. Courses completed prior to this date do not qualify for the additional 5 points earned.
- 5 additional points will be given to applicants who are Kentucky residents.

In the event of a tie in the total points, the applicants' GPAs will be rank ordered to determine admission to the ADN program.

*regionally accredited college
